



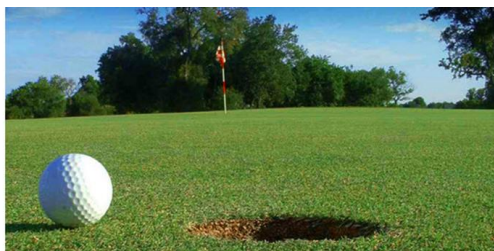

Rules of Play:

The Rules of Play shall be the Rules of Golf as approved by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews and local rules approved by the Executive of the Host Society and in conjunction with the Host Club.

Disputes:

Any dispute or protest must be lodged in writing with the Rules Committee within 15 minutes of completion of the round in which the dispute or protest arose.

Tuesday 10 October

36 holes. Start times 8.00am and 12.15pm. Draw in programme.

18 holes commencing 8.00am. Draw in programme. Prize giving approximately 1.30pm.

Ties

In the event of a tie for **first** only, a sudden death play-off shall be played commencing at the 14th hole and continue playing the 14th until a winner is found. All other ties will be decided by the Committee by count-back.

PLAYERS PLEASE NOTE

Off the Course:

- Comply with the Club's dress requirements.
- Golfing footwear must not be worn in the Clubhouse.
- Wear your name tag in the Clubhouse.
- If billeted, players must adhere to their Host's conditions at all times.

On the course:

- Observe course etiquette, therefore making the game an enjoyable experience.
- Check "Local Rules" before starting.
- Be still and quiet while others are playing shots.
- Walk quickly between shots and hold your place in the field.
- Wait until the group in front is out of range, before playing your ball.
- In the interests of all, players should play without delay. Mark your card at the next Tee, not beside the green just completed.
- Keep behind the group in front, not in front of the group behind.
- Allow groups to '*play through*' if you have lost a clear fairway on the group in front.
- Repair pitch marks on the green and replace divots on the fairways.
- Protect the putting surface, by not scuffing your feet, not leaning on your club and avoid standing too close to the hole when retrieving your ball.
- Before leaving a bunker, smooth out your marks and any others left by thoughtless players.
- Note – caddies are not allowed.
- Practice balls are available from the golf shop.

HISTORY OF EAGLES BOYS & GIRLS GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP OF NEW ZEALAND

The Eagles Boys Championship of NZ was set up by the Eagles Golfing Society of Wellington in 1981 and was played as part of and in conjunction with the Wellington Junior 72 Hole Stroke Play Championship, an event always played in the third term school holidays over two days at the Miramar Golf Club.

For the event to be authorised it was first necessary to have the approval of the Wellington Golf Association and the then sponsor 'Dentice Dry Cleaning' whose Managing Director, Ken Dentice was a keen golfer and a member of the Miramar Golf Club. This was given, together with the approval of the New Zealand Golf Association and the National Executive of the Eagles Golfing Society of New Zealand, and so the event was inaugurated.

The original format was for each Eagles Society (fifteen in all) to send a nominated boy to contest the event. The representative was selected by the District Golf Association Selectors or was the winner of an event promoted by the Eagles District Society. These representatives played for the Eagles Championship and were eligible to also win the Wellington event, as were the Australian Juniors who came over for experience in the Wellington Event and went on to play in the NZ AMP Boys Event.

In 1983 the late Mrs. Dorothy Thompson, Lady Captain of Miramar Golf Club, requested consideration be given for an Eagles Girls' Championship to be played in conjunction with the Boys' event. The request was considered by the Eagles Society and all approvals were obtained, the selection criteria being the same as the boys.

The first year of the combined event was played with the Wellington Boys' 72 Hole Championship. This was the first and only 72 Hole mixed junior Championship, and continued at Miramar until 1987.

In 1988 and until 1993 it was played in conjunction with the 54 Hole AMP Boys' Championship, the fifteen girls playing at the front of the field. This change came about through Grant Clements getting the approval of the New Zealand Golf Council and the sponsors, otherwise the event may have lapsed. The first year with AMP, the event was played at the Paraparaumu Beach Golf Club.

Because junior boys golf was exploding at such a rapid rate and handicaps were reducing fast, by 1993 lots of boys were not able to play in the event and it was time to consider the Eagles section of the event to stand alone.

The Eagles National Management together with Caltex Oil New Zealand Co. Ltd considered the proposal and approved the format we now have which is three players from each Society (one girl, one boy and another boy or girl) - never three of one gender.

It was a very generous sponsorship by Caltex, and is now, under current sponsorship of TaylorMade, a very important junior event on the national calendar. The tournament is now known as "The Eagles Boys' and Girls' Golf Championship of New Zealand".

The format of the event is for a total field of 60 players, 48 nominated players and 12 invited promising local players from the host society.

Considering this is a stand-alone event since 1994, national junior statistics are interesting. In 1992 there were 7243 boys playing. In 1996 there were 9794,

an increase of 35.22% and in 1996 there were 933 girls from a total club membership of 117,736 registered players.

During the years of the event, nine who have won have turned professional, three girls and six boys, together with several who have played in the event, namely Michael Long, Phillip Tautarangi, Steven Alker, Stephen Scahill and Stuart Thompson. Many winners of the boys and girls championship have represented their provinces and their country in the amateur ranks.

All Eagles trust this will continue to be a major national boys and girls event and that TaylorMade will continue to be recognised nationally by all sports people as a major sponsor promoting junior sport and sport generally.

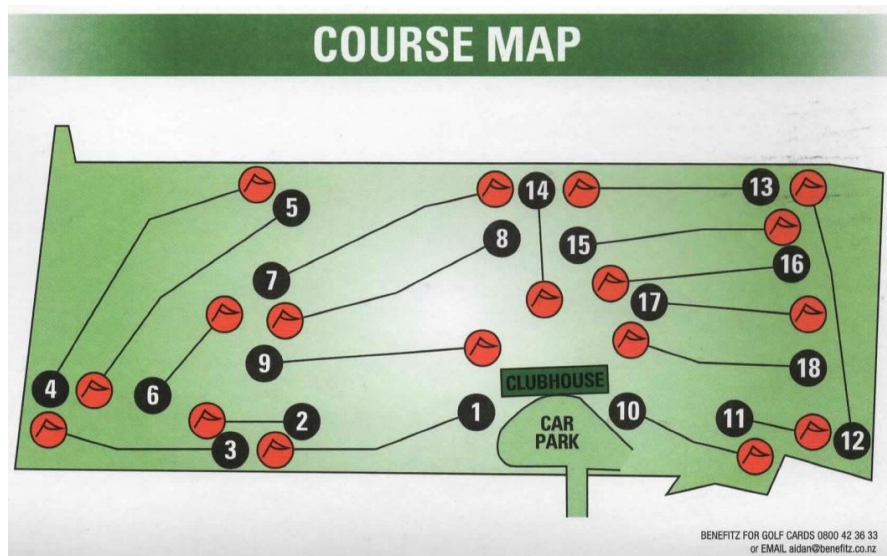

1 Par 5 NGATARAWA 433m 399m

Great starting hole though your drive needs to be accurate to set up your second shot. Two bunkers guard the green on the right, but you have a lot of green to play with.

2 Par 3 CRISIS 157m 130m

A large tree on the left and a bunker guarding the green on the right make for a demanding tee shot to a large sloping green. You can usually hit more club than you think.

3 Par 4 PINES 299m 264m

Two large pines guard the entrance to the green of a very makeable par four. Avoid the bunker on the right 220m from the tee. Out of bounds and long rough guard the left.

4 Par 5 THE LAKES **480m** **430m**

A demanding dog-leg hole with two hazards defending against those who choose to take the short cut. Out of bounds and hazards protect all the way down the left. A tight approach to the green through two greenside bunkers.

5 Par 4 WATTIES **351m** **322m**

A risk and reward hole for the long hitter willing to take on the tree-lined corner. Most will play to mid-fairway at the corner to set up a long shot to the green which is guarded by a bunker on the right and a drop off at the back.

6 Par 3 LONG SHOT **176m** **154m**

A long accurate tee shot can set up a birdie chance. Bunkers guarding the green await shots slightly off course. Be aware of a deceptive slope on the green.

7 Par 5 HERONS **451m** **434m**

The second shot on this dog-leg par five is pivotal to at least achieving par. Avoid the fairway bunker guarding the short-cut drive, and those guarding the green. The pin on the top tier makes for a more demanding approach.

(NOTE: owing to work on the course this hole has been shortened and is temporarily a Par 4. Disregard this yardage.)

8 Par 4 RUAHINE **350m** **296m**

A relatively straight-forward long par four. The green is best approached from the left side of the fairway. A nasty bunker protects the right side.

(NOTE: the tee has been brought forward for the time being to accommodate work on the course. Disregard this yardage.)

9 Par 4 MIDWAY **395m** **325m**

An accurate tee shot is needed to avoid the large fairway bunker on the left, trees and large hollow on the right. You will always have a long second shot to the green guarded by bunkers on both sides.

10 Par 4(M) GUMS **396m**
Par 5 (L) **412m**

A long drive to the right side of the fairway sets you up for a long shot to the green. Most require three shots to reach the green. Being under the hole makes the putt easier.

11 Par 3 PLATEAU **138m** **113m**

A deceptive hole with most tee shots coming up short or disappearing down the left bank to the hazard. A very large kidney-shaped green with the pin position likely to alter club choice markedly.

12 Par 4 POPLARS **312m** **297m**

Our signature hole with a very small landing area to provide an easy shot in to a sloping green with fall offs on both sides. Driveable by the very long hitters, but a real risk and reward hole.

13 Par 5 BOUNDARY **445m** **406m**

An accurate drive sets you up for an easy par on a long straight hole. Trouble in the trees on the left and out of bounds all the way up the right. A long green protected by bunkers on both sides.

14 Par 3 DECEPTION 148m 136m

A good par 3 guarded by narrowing trees off the tee and a deep bunker extending the length of the green on the left. Take note of wind direction and strength when selecting your club.

15 Par 4 FAR AWAY 377m 316m

Once again an accurate tee shot will set you up for a par. Fairway narrowed by tall trees 120m from the green. Like most holes an uphill putt is the easiest option.

16 Par 4 SUNSET 354m 313m

Often played into the prevailing wind making it a long hole. A drive to the left side of the fairway is the safest option. Approach shots can often run off the elevated green.

17 Par 4 PEAK VIEW 320m 269m

Take time to enjoy the view straight to Te Mata Peak. A demanding par four guarded by water hazards 30m short of the green on both sides. Take an extra club with your approach to allow for dead ground.

18 Par 5 PARKVALE 499m 395m

The longest par five provides a challenging final hole. A drive up the bank leaves you in great shape. Tall trees narrow the fairway 70m out and deep bunkers guard a very generous but deceptive green.
